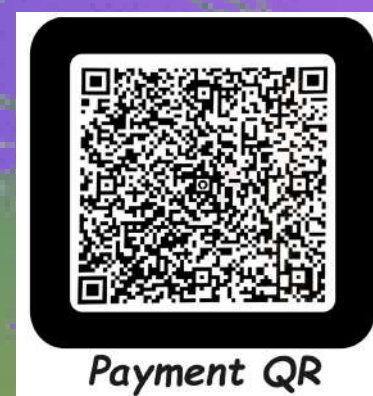

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About the University

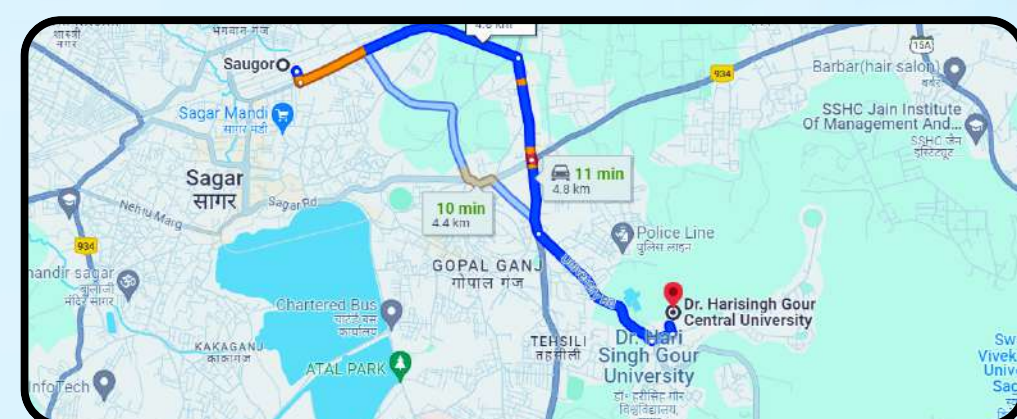
Dr. Harisingh Gour Vishwavidyalaya, formerly the University of Saugor, is a central university in Sagar, Madhya Pradesh. It was established in 1946 by Dr. Hari Singh Gour, an eminent legal expert and India's first Vice Chancellor of the University of Delhi. He donated his lifetime savings of about Rs 2 crores to set up this university.

It is spread over 1312 acres of lush green hills and forests; the university has 36 academic departments, 11 schools, 19 affiliated colleges, and around 9,000 students. It offers undergraduate, postgraduate, and doctorate degrees spanning diverse subjects like Pharmacy, Criminology, Performing Arts & Business Management, etc., along with conventional programs. The university prides itself on its eco-friendly, picturesque campus with amenities like hostels, banks, post offices, canteens, etc. It is internationally acclaimed for its research facilities and discoveries.

Khajuraho Group of Monuments: The Khajuraho Group of Monuments are a group of Hindu and Jain temples in Chhatarpur district, Madhya Pradesh, India. The temples are famous for their Nagara-style architectural symbolism and a few erotic sculptures.



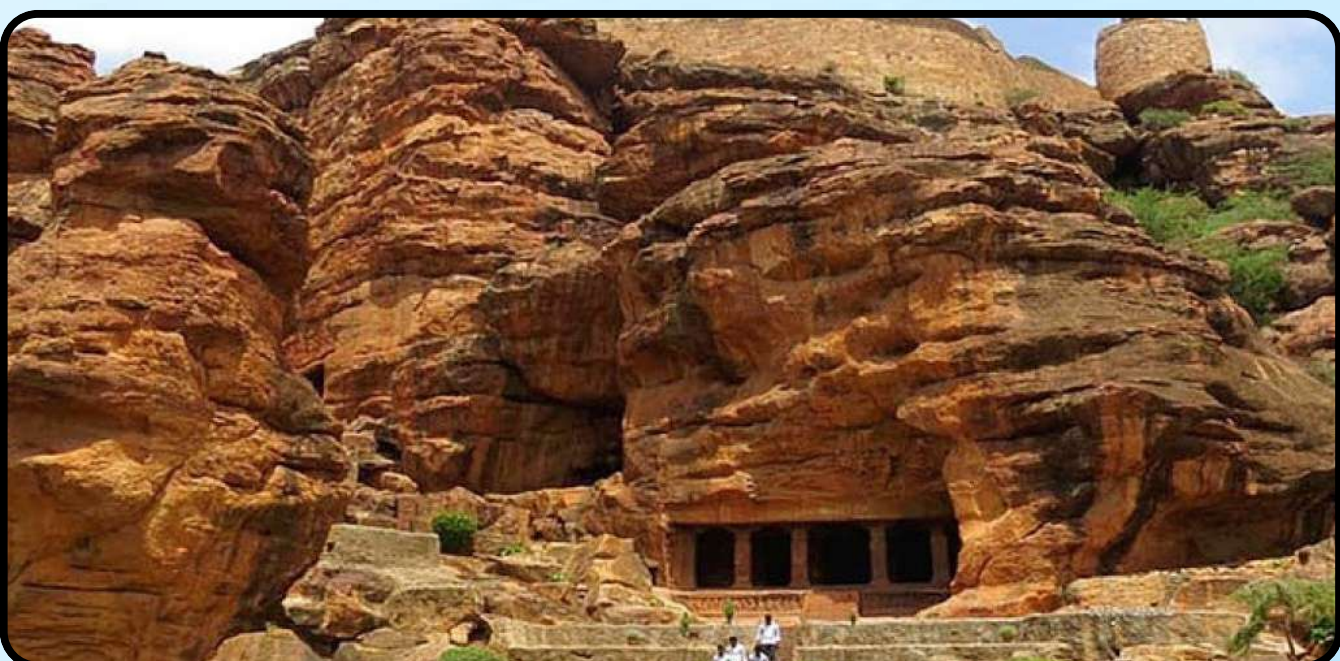
Sanchi is a Buddhist complex, famous for its Great Stupa, on a hilltop at Sanchi Town in Raisen District of the State of Madhya Pradesh, India. It is located, about 23 kilometers from Raisen town, district headquarter and 46 kilometres north-east of Bhopal, capital of Madhya Pradesh.



Rahatgarh Water Fall: 60 km west of Sagar on Bhopal Sagar Road renowned for its battlement ramparts, its gates and its ruins of palaces temples and mosques. It is picturesquely situated on the steep bank of the river Bina which is crossed at this point by a fine bridge of fourteen arches, completed in 1863



Orchha is a town, near the city of Niwari in the Niwari district of Madhya Pradesh state, India. The town was established by a Bundela rajput ruler Rudra Pratap Singh some time after 1501, as the seat of an eponymous former princely state of covering parts of central & north India, in the Bundelkhand region.



The **Bhimbetka rock shelters** are an archaeological site in central India that spans the Paleolithic and Mesolithic periods and the historic period. It exhibits the earliest traces of human life in India and evidence of the Stone Age starting at the site in Acheulian times



Nauradehi Wildlife Sanctuary is the largest wildlife sanctuary in Madhya Pradesh. The sanctuary covers nearly 1197 km² area across three districts i.e. Sagar, Damoh and Narsinghpur, of Madhya Pradesh.
