1. Curricular Aspects

1.2. Postgraduate Programme

M. A./ M. Sc. courses: The postgraduate courses are of four semesters having the total 81 credits. There are five papers in the first semester including four theory papers and one practical paper of four credits each. In the second semester, there are three theory papers and two practical papers which are of four credits each along with an open elective of 2 credits which is to be opted from other departments. In the first two semesters all the papers are core papers except one elective paper in the second semester. In III and IV semesters the course is dived into two groups namely Group-A: Biological Anthropology and Broup-B: Socio-cultural Anthropology. In the third semester, in both groups A and B, there are three core papers with four credits each and two elective papers with three credits each and one open elective with two credits. Again, in the fourth semsester in both groups A and B, there are two core papers of 4 credits and a dissertation on the basis of fieldwork for a minimum of 21 days which carries six credits. Besides these, students have to choose three elective papers of three credits each. M.A./M.Sc. Degrees in

Anthropology are conferred on the basis of qualifying degrees. The syllabus of each programme is revised and updated every year through Board of Studies.

The admission in Ph. D. is made through all India entrance test and followed by an interview. The number of seats may vary subject to the availability of vacant positions in the department. There is a six month course work that has to be passed by each student. The department is well equipped with advanced instruments used in survey and research and that facilitate our doctoral students. The Department has established its credibility in the field of research. Most often, the problems selected for doctoral research are of applied in nature. The major fields of research are: Human Genetics, Nutrition Studies, Medical Anthropology, Anthropology of Education, Dermatoglyphics, Psychological Anthropology, Demography, Urban Slums Studies, Disaster Studies, Tribal Studies, Rural development, Health and nutrition and Resource appraisal. This Department is committed to undertake research in a way to provide rationale for formulation and adoption of suitable policies for improvement in socio-economic conditions.
