

7. Institutional Values and Best Practices

1. The department follows democratic way in decision making through departmental council and DUGC/DPGC.
2. Development of academic skills through compulsory presentations by students (in course curriculum).
3. Weekly department presentation by faculties and research scholars.
4. Compulsory one month rigorous fieldwork training to post graduate students in remote tribal areas of India.
5. UG and PG dissertations based on fieldwork.

8. Competitive Exam friendly course curriculum.

11. Field Visits of students to the sites of archaeological and anthropological importance.
