These rituals instil a sense of cultural and moral identity, guiding students on the path of righteousness. 3. Association Success and human association go hand in hand; the people you surround yourself with can either propel you forward or hold you back. Building positive associations can provide valuable support, mentorship, and networking opportunities, all of which are crucial for achieving success in various aspects of life.
4. Unity among individuals is the cornerstone of human success, as collective effort and collaboration often lead to greater achievements.
5. Recognition of person, acknowledging and appreciating individuals for their efforts is a vital factor in their journey to success.
