## REGISTRATION WORK FLOW

MHRD-GIAN is a global programme. The interested participants have to follow two stage processes. In the first stage, they are required to register online at GIAN portal-<http://www.gianiitkgp.ac.in>. They have to follow instructions at "Course Registration Portal" and submit login details with brief academic achievements. Rs. 500 (rupees five hundred only) have to be paid online for one time registration at GIAN portal. Participants then need to select this course 'Emotion, Cognition and Consciousness: the Eastern and Western Perspectives' from the list at "Course Registration". 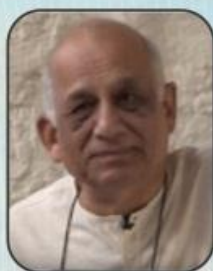
## SCOPE OF THE PROGRAMME

Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Government of India has taken a new initiative as Global Initiative of Academic Networks (GIAN) for academic interaction in higher education with the intention to tap talent pool of academicians, scientists, researchers and entrepreneurs of the globe in association of the higher educational institutes of India. To this end, a five days course on "Emotion, Cognition and Consciousness: The Eastern and Western Perspectives" has been approved by MHRD under the GIAN Programme which is being organized by Department of Psychology, Dr. Harisingh Gour Vishavidyalaya, Sagar.

## ABOUT THE COURSE

The programme will cover sharing of Indian and Western views on emotion, cognition and consciousness among researchers, faculty members and students. Western psychology is largely confined to the physical and the social dimensions which are accessible to the ordinary waking consciousness. On the other hand intellectual tradition of India followed different assumptions. According to Indian views, the most fundamental reality is *Atman* which is indivisible. Indian view includes psychological phenomena like consciousness as core element of reality. It takes not physics but 'knowledge of the self' as the fundamental science. It may be clear that Eastern (Indian) and Western views of reality led to a very different sense of what psychology is about, how it is to be conducted. "For those under the influence of the physicalist worldview, psychology deals either with outer behaviour or with mental processes that happen within the neurophysiological apparatus of individual human beings; even those who stress social influences, tacitly assume that such influences are transferred by physical means". There are similar and different Western and Indian psychological concepts to explain and understand human behaviour. The basic purpose of this course is to integrate the Western and Indian thoughts on emotion, cognition and consciousness.

## ABOUT THE FOREIGN FACULTY



Prof. Anand C. Paranjpe is presently associated as a Professor Emeritus, with Department of Psychology, Simon Fraser University, British Columbia, Canada since 2001. He has received his university education from Poona University, India followed by a Post-Doctoral Fellowship at Harvard University, Cambridge, MA. He was Professor of Psychology at Simon Fraser University, Canada from 1984 to 2001. His work was authored by Prof. Carl Ratner and published in *Psychological Theories* (New York: Springer Verlag). He is also winner of Smith-Mundt and Fulbright Award given by the US Educational Foundation in India for post-doctoral research at Harvard University under the supervision of Prof. Erik H. Erikson. He has published more than one hundred research articles/book chapters/reports/book reviews in the international journals of repute.

## ABOUT THE HOST FACULTY

Professor Uday Jain is presently associated with the department of Psychology, Dr. Harisingh Gour University, Sagar as an honorary professor since 2016. He has also held the position of Vice-Chancellor of A. P. S. University, Rewa, Madhya Pradesh. He had been invited as a visiting professor by different Indian Universities and visited many foreign Universities also. He published four books including one from Sage. He had been a Fulbright Fellow at the University of Chicago, and Swarthmore College, Philadelphia, USA. He has contributed more than 100 research papers in Reputed Research Journals of India and abroad and contributed around 30 chapters in edited books.
